




FAST FASHION:

The mass production of clothing by retailers to reflect recent trends and fads.



WHYIS FAST FASHION 50 HARMFUL?

- The toxic dyes that many of these garments are made with have severely polluted waterways.
- The significant increase on these mass-produced items
 contribute to fossil fuel usage and carbon emissions. Fast
 Fashion accounts for up to 10% of global carbon dioxide
 output—more than international flights and shipping
 combined.
- The production of these garments requires lots of cottonwhich requires excess amounts of water and uses insecticides and pesticides. These chemicals are absorbed into soils and waterways causing more pollution.
- There are approximately 92 million tons of clothes related landfill waste a year. Due to the trendy nature of fast fashion, these clothes are only worn a few times before being discarded.

UNETHICAL WORK BEHIND FAST FASHION

Some of the most dangerous effects of fast fashion are felt by the people producing these clothes. While we may envision this production as a machine-based operation, there are many people who work to create garments. Due to high demand, met with cheap cost, employees are forced work in unsuitable conditions for small wages to keep up. The production of these clothes is almost entirely done in countries with no wage regulation, so employees are being exploited. 80% of these employees- who are largely made up of women and children- do not make a living wage. These same people are also exposed to dangerous chemicals in toxic amounts, such as highly fluorinated compounds, which have been proven to cause cancer.

ETHICAL BUYING:

- 2. Look at prices and think about labor costs
- 3. Buy second hand
- 4. Learn how to identify ethical brands from fast fashion
- 5. Do not over purchase

GEAUX LOCAL!

WHY BUY?

Purchasing locally can help you to see what exactly you're buying, where its coming from, and where your money is going.

ASK QUESTIONS

Buying locally gives you the opportunity to ask questions about what you're buying and dig deeper to ensure there are ethical practices in use.

CAUTION

It is also important to remember that local businesses are not immune to being fast fashion. For example, many boutiques purchase clothing from unethical distributors to sell in their stores for higher prices. However, supporting local businesses and helping to ensure jobs within the community are important.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

When looking at a garment, the cost can be a dead giveaway that it was not made ethically. For example, finding a pair of sweatpants for ten dollars is too good to be true. For those pants to be made and shipped for 10 dollars, the labor cost would have to be next to nothing. One tip is to analyze a garment and approximate how long it would take a skilled worker to make it.


Multiply that buy an average minimum wage (approx. \$10). If the garment is less than that amount, it is more than likely fast fashion.

BUYING SECOND-HAND

Currently, most ethical brands aren't easily accessible to all people. An affordable way to shop sustainably is to shop second hand. For example, taking hand- medowns and shopping at thrift shops and reconsignment stores. Giving new life to clothing that would have otherwise been discarded not only helps to keep those clothes out of landfills, but also reduces the demand to produce new clothing. By recirculating clothes within the community, we can make a difference in clothing production numbers.





IDENTIFYING FAST FASHION WEBSITES:

Sometimes it can be difficult to tell whether a retailer is ethical or not when online shopping. There are also many ways companies use loopholes to misguide consumers and have them believe their products are eco-friendly.





GREEN WASHING:

THE ACT OR PRACTICE OF MAKING A PRODUCT, POLICY, ACTIVITY, ETC. APPEAR TO BE MORE ENVIRONMENTALLY FRIENDLY OR LESS ENVIRONMENTALLY DAMAGING THAN IT REALLY IS.

Many clothing websites make disclosure statements about how they work to promote ethical practices, however there is no way to prove this. It is important to look for these empty statements on websites and look for real examples of sustainable contributions.

BUT REALLY, HOW DO YOU KNOW?

Many websites are not transparent about their manufacturing processes, so even being educated on what ethical buying is can't always help you to determine how sustainable a retailer is.

CLOTHING LONGEVITY:

How you choose to buy can make a difference.

- Reject Fads and trends. Look for clothing that is wearable for multiple years.
- Try not to over buy. Only buying what you
 need reduces demand for clothing.
- Stay away from buying clothes intended for
 one occasion. When you buy, think about
 how many times a week or month you will
 wear it.
 - Is it able to be worn with multiple outfits?

End of Life care

When you are done using a garment, don't throw it away! Here are some things to do with old clothes:

Can it be upcycled?

Try mending holes or dying shirts with stains. Paint over imperfections or add embellishments to give clothes character.

Make it New

There are ways to make old tshirts and pants into pillows
and tote bags. You can also
cut up old garments and use
them for wash cloths and
makeup removers.
