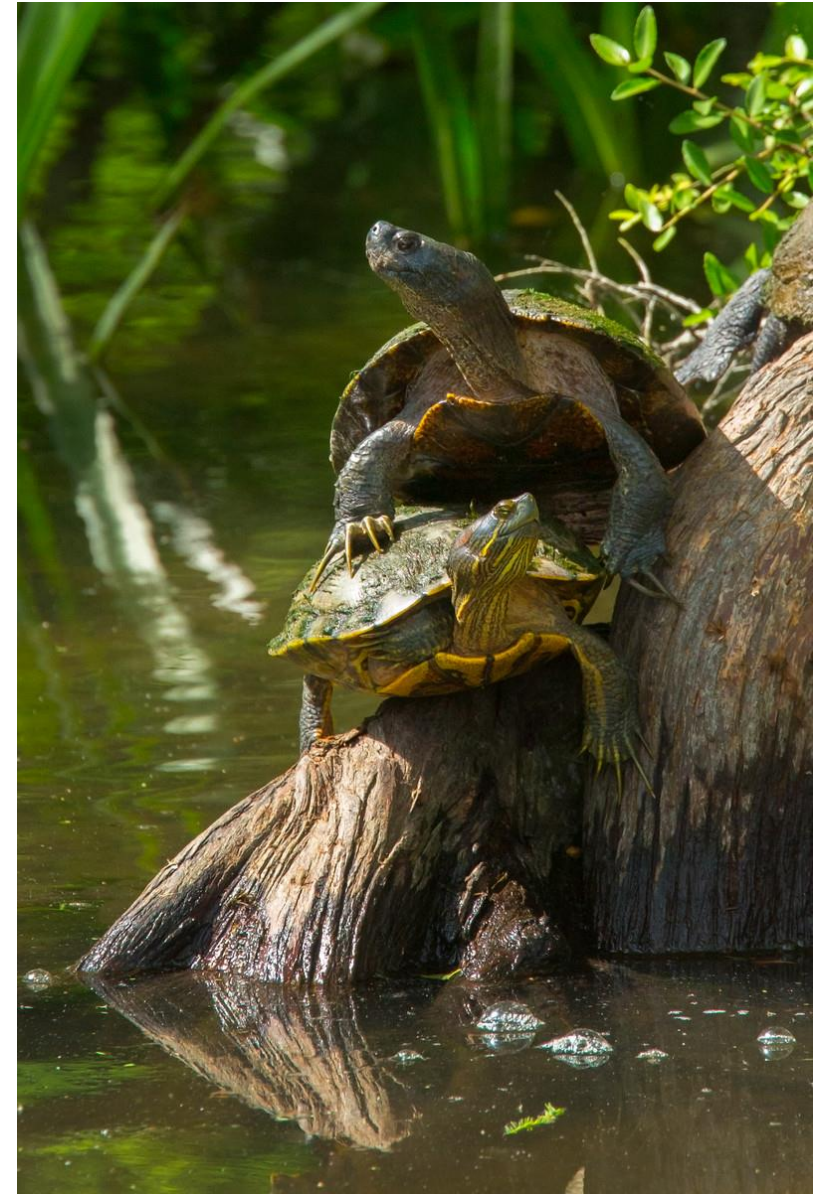

# SUSTAINABILITY RESOURCES: RECYCLING

The University has been recycling since 2004. We are proud to offer recycling in almost every campus building and outside throughout campus along main pathways.

Currently in 2024 there is recycling lobby bins in almost 90% of all academic buildings on main campus and many more in the lobbies on frequently used non-academic buildings.

**At UL Lafayette we offer various types of recycling:**

**Plastic Bag Recycling** – 10 locations on Main Campus

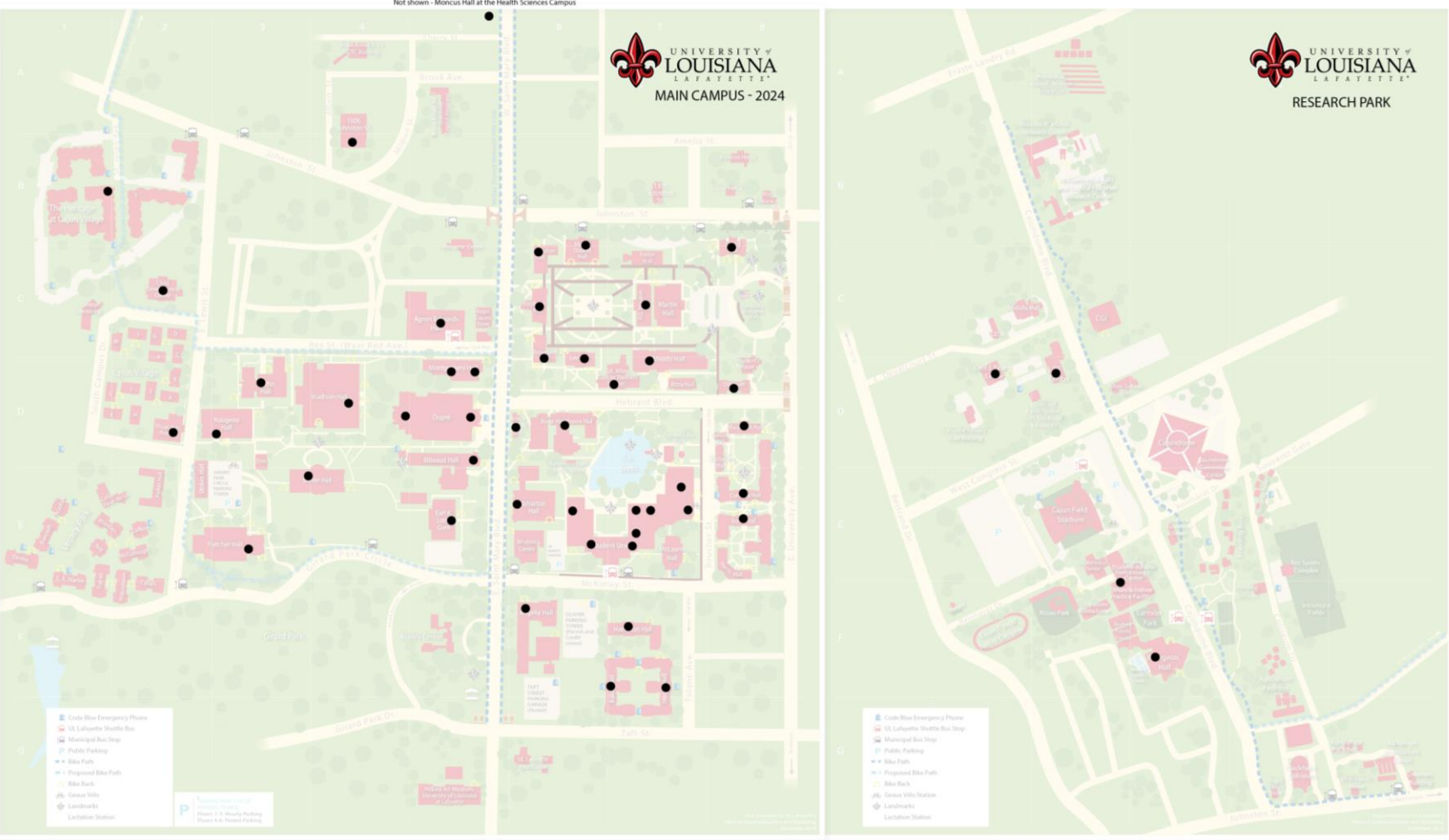

- o Dropping them off at the **Martin Hall Mailroom under the ledge.**



Please let us know the amount of recycling in your request. This way we can arrange pick up accordingly!

What happens to the cartridges?

We recycle ink & toner cartridges through Office Depo and an organization called Funding Factory.

The Funding Factory has diverted over 43.3 million pounds of ink items from the landfill!

The University of Louisiana at Lafayette and UL Dining Services are committed to sustainability. The Good to Geaux system reduces single-use plastic waste associated with to-go food containers.

### HOW?

Pick up or purchase your initial OZZI token from your residence hall or at the Cypress Lake Dining Hall front desk Jan. 11 – Jan. 15.

Instead of disposing containers into landfill bins, you will return empty Good to Geaux containers to one of five OZZI machines stationed at dining locations across campus. The containers will be washed and sanitized then used again for future meal service.

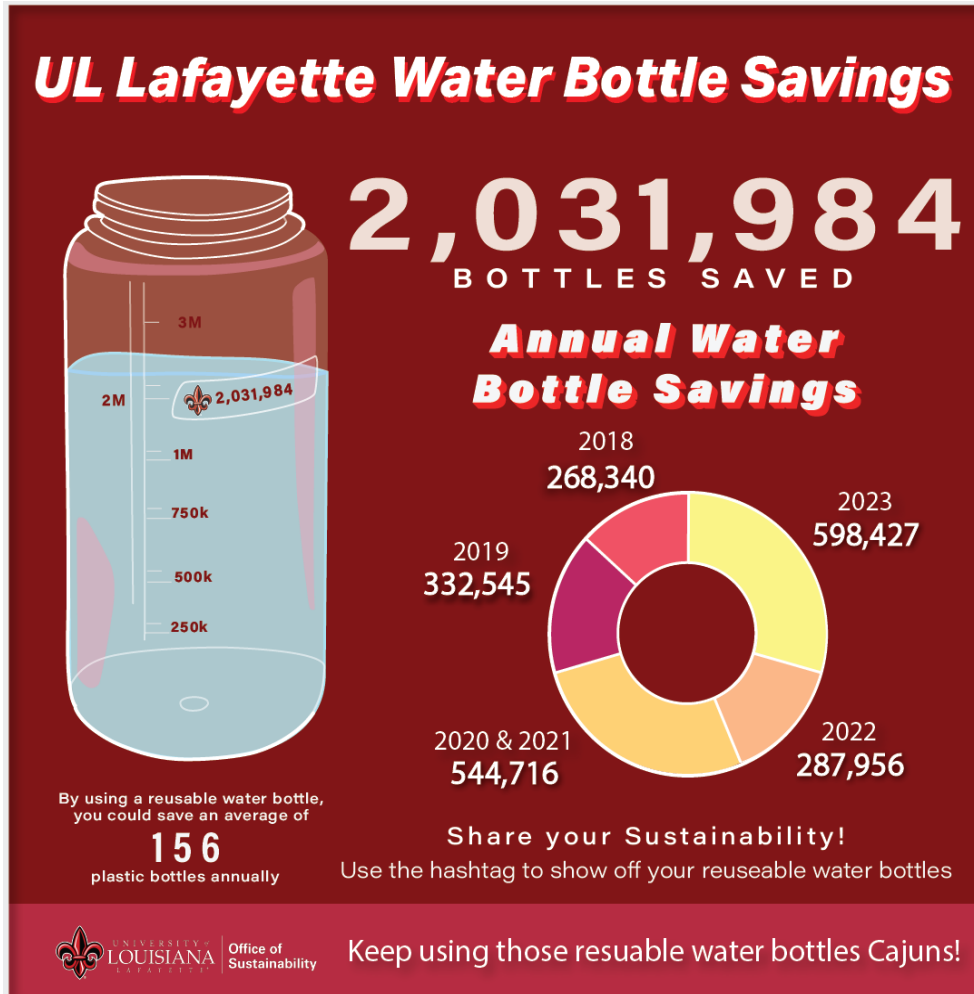

# WATER BOTTLE REFILLERS



By using reusable water bottles at the 119 water bottle refilling stations across campus students, faculty, and staff have saved 598,427 plastic water bottles in 2023!!

The first water bottle refilling station was installed in 2018 and since then over 2,031,984 water bottles have been saved on campus!

There are various bike routes that run throughout campus and connect to Cajun Dome Blvd bicycle path

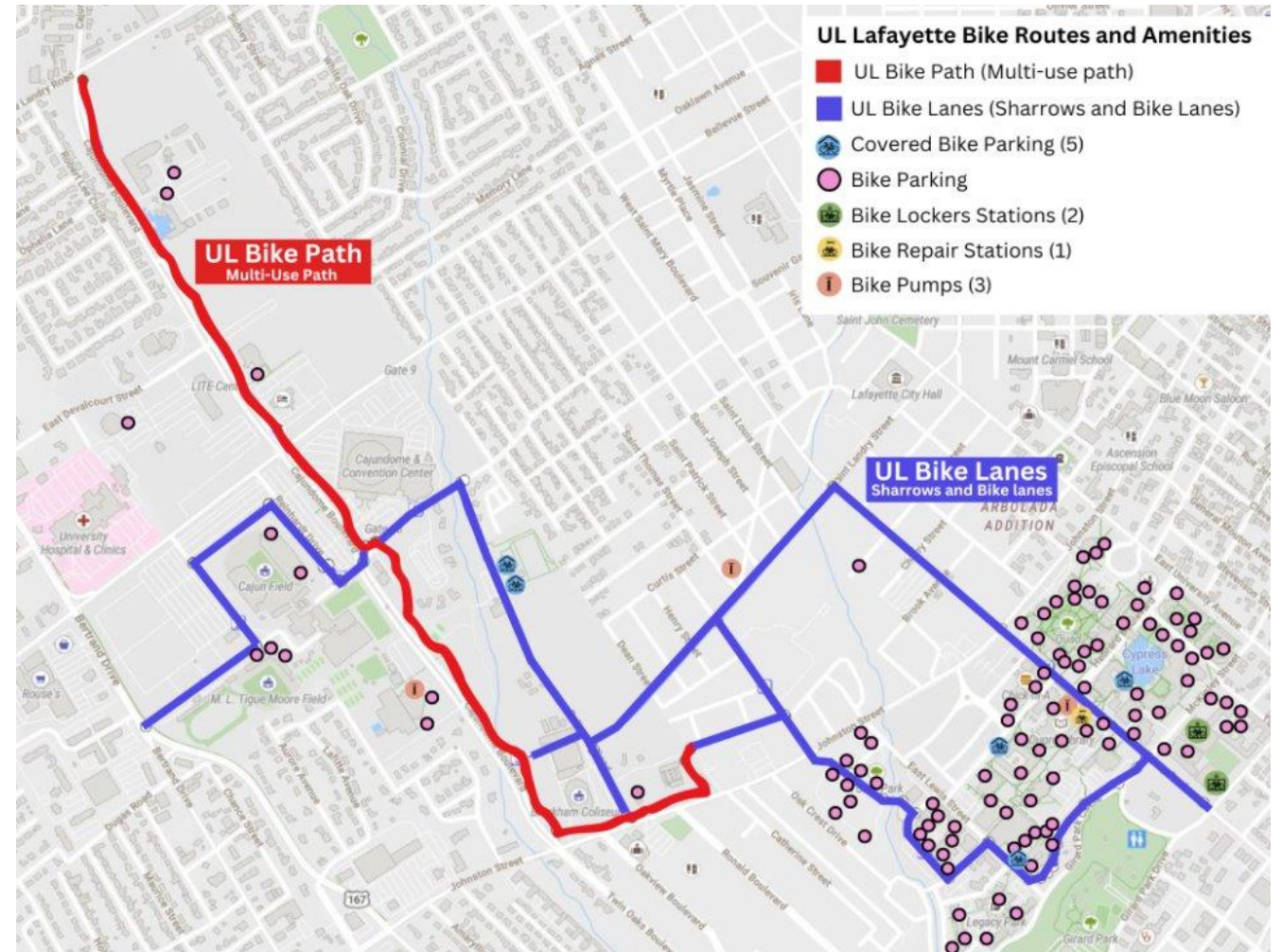

# UL LAFAYETTE LIVING LAB PROJECT

The Living Lab Signage Project is a multi-phase project that intends to transform the University of Louisiana at Lafayette's campus into a walking arboretum—a living laboratory. By installing educational signage along existing pathways, visitors and students can engage more with the diverse habitats on our campus and become more knowledgeable about sustainability initiatives and its impacts. The goal of the interpretive signage is to showcase the interconnectedness of various areas on campus and educate visitors about south Louisiana's biodiversity, environment, and plant and animal species.

As of Summer 2024 there have been **3 large educational signs about Campus Trees and Pollinator Habitats** and **8 small special habitat signs** installed across campus.



# ALTERNATIVE SERVICE SPRING + FALL BREAKS

Recently we have created an **Alternative Fall and Spring Break Program** where students can use their break to participate in service statewide and nationally.

We are still in the process of developing this program, but we have secured our first site partner, Coalition to Restore Coastal Louisiana (CRCL) for the Fall Semester to send students to participate in service work near the coast in Louisiana so they can learn about coastal restoration and volunteerism while providing them an opportunity to give back and strengthen our community.



# SUSTAINABILITY FACULTY FELLOWS

The UL Lafayette Sustainability Faculty Fellows program aims to build a community of faculty and researchers dedicated to exploring issues of sustainability from the local to global scale, service-learning and community building, and multidisciplinary problem solving. The program is designed to support faculty in developing new sustainability course offerings, and/or redeveloping existing courses to include sustainability principles. Faculty apply to be fellows and are awarded a stipend for the participation and incorporation of sustainability into a new or existing course syllabus. Thanks to the Sustainability Faculty Fellows, **18 sustainability courses were added.**

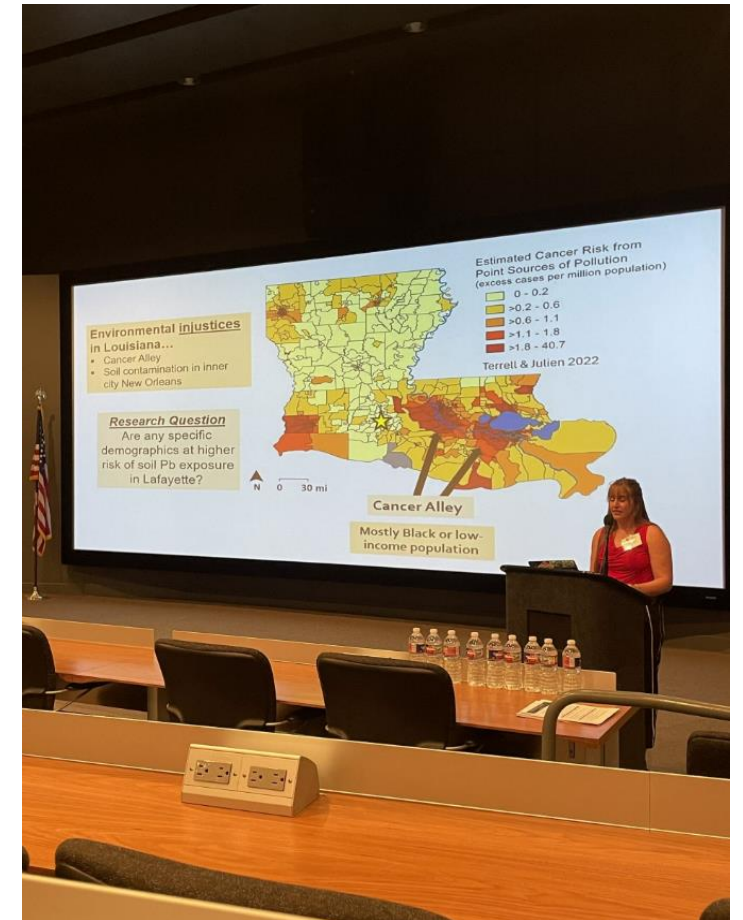
# SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH AWARDS

In Spring 2023, the University of Louisiana at Lafayette awarded \$40,800 in faculty research grants related to Sustainable Development - that is, research related to Social Inclusion, Environmental Protection or Economic Growth - and to the 17 United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals. This initiative was a collaboration between 6 campus entities: Faculty Affairs, the Graduate School, the Office of Campus Diversity the Office of Sustainability and Community Engagement, Brian Bolton, Professor of Finance and the Dwight W. Andrus, Jr. / BORSF Eminent Scholar Endowed Chair in Finance and the Office for Research, Innovation & Economic Development.

This program has several key goals: (1) to celebrate the amazing research being done across the UL Lafayette campus, (2) to show how vital research on sustainable development is for Southern Louisiana and the Gulf Coast Region, and (3) to create a platform to share research and to encourage collaborations where faculty can help solve some of society's greatest challenges. This Program is expected to have at least 4 rounds of research and awards.

Since Spring 2023 the Sustainable Development Research Awards has had:

3 Rounds      87 awards given to students, faculty, and staff      \$174,800 in awards.

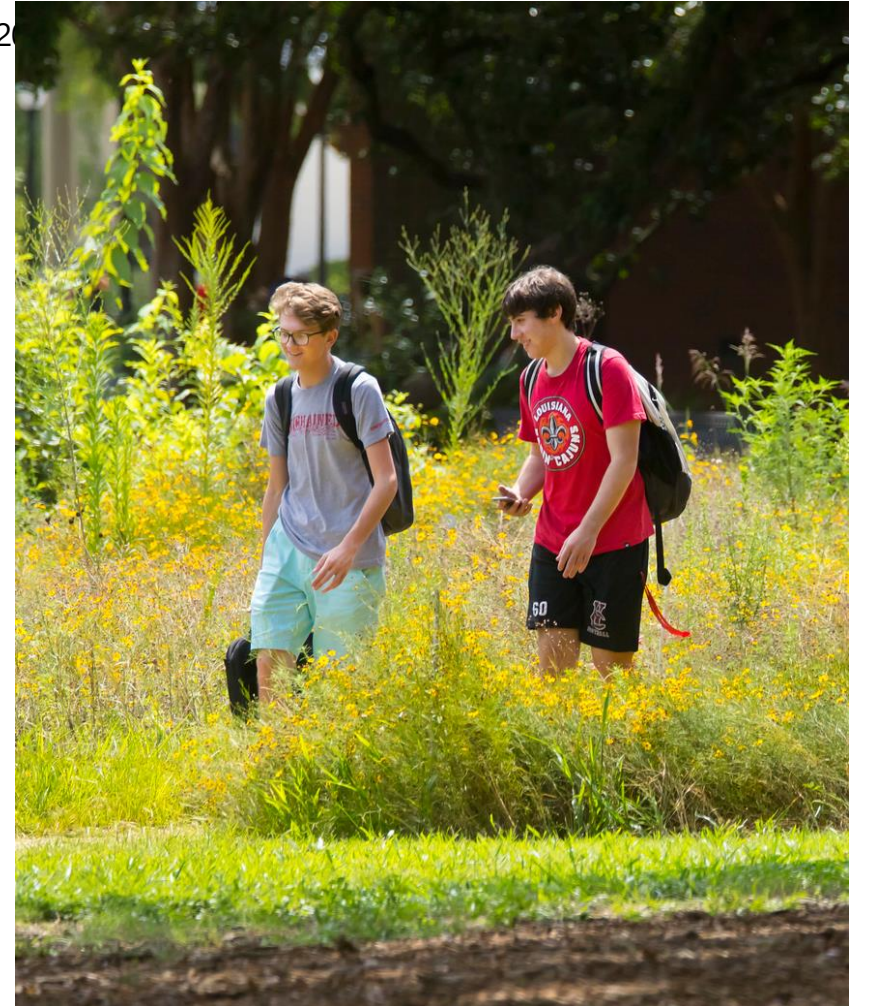

# SUSTAINABILITY STATS

- **2,031,984 water bottles saved** on campus since 2018 with the use of the water bottle refiller fountains, 2023 saw 598,427 water bottles saved on campus
- **143 water bottle refillers** located across campus
- **19,779 uses of the reuseable Good to Geaux** containers in 2023 at 5 locations across campus
- **Ban on single-use disposable polystyrene** since 2018
- **Ban on using Tobacco products** on campus grounds with the Tobacco-Free Policy since 2014
- Roughly **484 Southern Live Oak trees** on UL Lafayette's campus
- **Sustainability Managed Landscapes**(that we specifically manage)
  - 2 Urban Cajun Prairies (Bourgeois park + Madison and this one is also a Bioswale)
  - 2 Rain Gardens (Fletcher Hall rain garden + Hilliard Art Museum)
  - 3 Bioswales (Madison, Wharton, Judice)
  - 1 coulee buffer strip at Bourgeois Park
  - 11 pollinator habitats (this includes the green infrastructure locations listed above)
  - 1 community garden at Cajun Village
- **2024 Krewe de Coulee Clean Up Event Stats**
  - **170 volunteers** collected **109 bags (1085lbs) in 2 hours**
    - With **40 Krewes working** at **19 sites** along the parade route
    - **2.25 miles** of parade routes cleaned

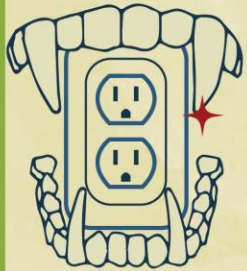
# WHAT YOU CAN DO?

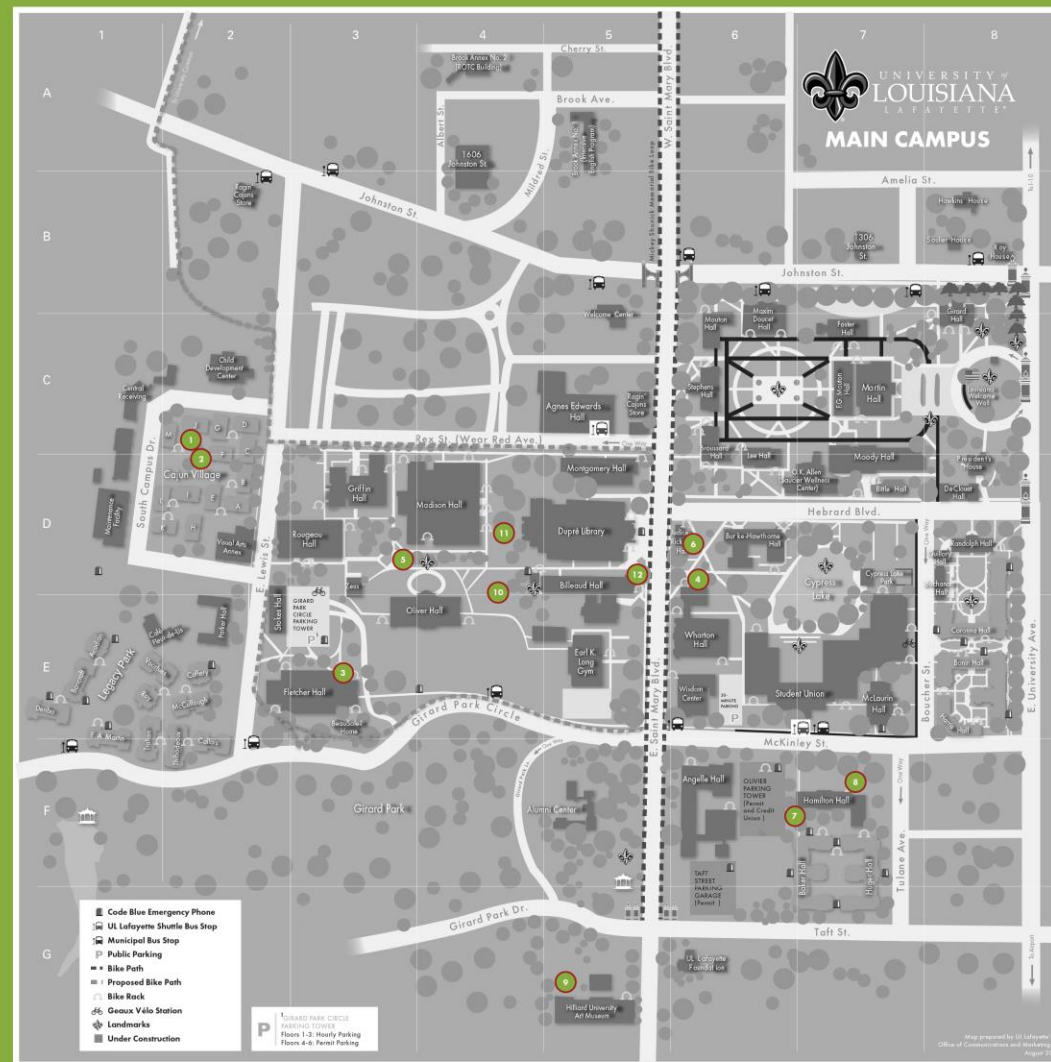

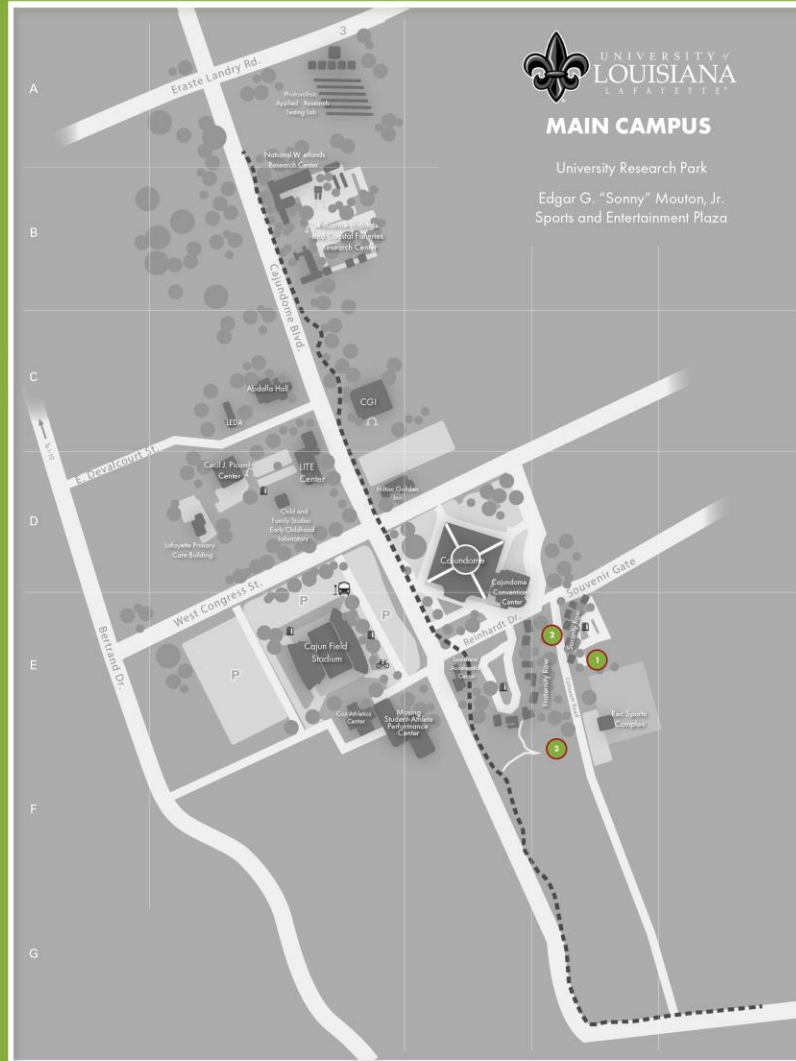
